## Tis the Season for Pumpkin Spice and Everything Nice ...at least that's what I hope Thanksgiving brings to you and your family this year.

In the midst of the barrage of political commercials and the images of chaos and war on our screens, sometimes it's necessary and vital for our souls to take a moment...and take a break away from it all...and to give thanks for all that *is good* in the world...because sometimes the reality of what we see and hear and what some are living in the midst of, can be quite overwhelming.

So I ask you...where do you see good in the world...right now, as your reading the Chalice? Where do you find joy? Where do you find hope? Whatever your answers may be, I encourage you to lift those up to God at this moment and give thanks...give thanks for your life...for your loves...for your hopes...for your joys and for where you see good in the world. And then...please pray for those who are unable to take a break from the chaos in which they are living.

#### Now getting back to that pumpkin spice and everything nice...

For many of you, pumpkin pie will be served on Thanksgiving...but I offer you another option...one that you may begin to serve from here on out. What follows is an absolutely delicious recipe from our very own beloved, Jo Nissen (thank you!). She served this at our Monday Morning Bible Study a few weeks ago and received rave reviews and many asks for the recipe. ENJOY!!!

#### **Pumpkin Torte**

Crush 24 graham cracker squares.

Add  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of melted butter and mix. Put into a 9x13 pan.

Beat 8oz softened cream cheese, 2 eggs and <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup of sugar.

Pour mixture over graham cracker crsust and bake at 350 for 20 minutes.

(or until a toothpick comes out clean)

Dissolve 1 envelope of Knox Gelatin in ¼ cup cold water.

Mix together 1lb can pure pumkpin, 3 egg yolks, ½ cup sugar, ½ cup milk, ½ tsp salt, 1 tsp cinnamon. Cook over medium heat until eggs are cooked and sugar is dissolved

(3 to 4 minutes). Add gelatin mixture and stir together. Cool well.

Beat 3 egg whites and ¼ cup sugar until soft peaks form. Fold into pumpkin mixture. Pour this mixture over crust and cream cheese mixture. Chill until set.

Top with whipped cream and keep refrigerated.

Thank you, again, Jo...and you are one in which I see so much good!

#### **Food Pantry News**

The food pantry is asking for these items for November:

instant potatoes gravy stove top stuffing

corn muffin mix canned cranberries Jello

sweet potatoes 13-15 lb. turkeys



They start giving out Thanksgiving food on November 22nd, so they would like donations of turkeys and Thanksgiving food by November 18th in order to know what they need to purchase. The Pantry really needs your help this year. The food supply from the government, Racine County Food Bank, and general donations has significantly decreased at the same time the number of families coming to the pantry has drastically increased. Last year they served about 200 families in 6 hours in the week before Thanksgiving and expect the same or more this year.

If you have leftover Halloween candy the pantry can use it for the small treat bags they give to clients at Christmas. They can also use reusable cloth shopping bags for clients who walk to the pantry and brown paper shopping bags and lightly used plastic shopping bags for packing groceries. If you get calendars, greeting cards, pens or pencils you will not use they can go to the pantry too.

The pantry is extremely grateful to all who volunteer and donate to help us feed the hungry in our community! Thank you!

## <u>Diaper Ministry Minute - a quick update on what's happening with the new ministry.</u>



We are off and crawling! Our first two ministry sessions are in the books and we have 24 volunteers who have served 24 clients!

- 2 of those 24 clients were adults (pass the word, if you know of anyone who needs adult diapers, we have a LOT!)
- 22 clients were children between the ages of just a few days old to 7 years
- 3 of them came to both our grand opening in the evening and our daytime 2nd ministry session.
- 20 of the volunteers have signed up for staffing! How wonderful is it to have more volunteers than we need?
- 13 of the volunteers have been "trained". .The remainder will be trained in the upcoming weeks.

The response from parents/caregivers has been overwhelming thankfulness. In addition to the diapers, we have given out A&D ointment, wipes, some baby food/formula that was donated to the food pantry, and a few books that were all very well received and appreciated.

Thank you to everyone who has prayed, donated both time and diapers and shown an interest in this much-needed ministry. Now that we've gotten our crawling legs we plan to do more advertising and will be walking and running before long!

#### **Third Tuesday Bible Study**

November 19th from 10:00 to 11:30 our next bible study will focus on Mark 13:1 to Mark 13:37. It is a time when Jesus is talking to his disciples about the trials believers in Christ would face. In Mark 13: 14-20 Jesus forecasts the fall of Jerusalem and "the awful terror of the siege" (page 360).

Then comes the more personal forecast in 13:9-13: "they will hand you over to councils and they will scourge you in the synagogues." Four of his disciples ask Jesus "when shall these things be?" Jesus answers them rather indirectly. "For false Messiahs and false prophets will arise....to lead the elect astray" (Mark 13:21).

Certainly relevant in our time, Jesus said, "when you hear of wars and reports of wars, do not be disturbed. These things must happen" (13:7-8). There will be wars, earthquakes, and famines. "But no man knows about that day and that hour.....So be watchful!" (Mark 28-37). Jesus makes these prophesies about the fall of Jerusalem and the destruction of the Temple but Jesus himself did not know when "the master of the house comes."

This is the last section before the Last Supper followed by the arrest of Jesus. Meet at Julie's home, 136 Steeplechase Drive, on November 19 at 10:00 to discuss Mark 13:1 to 13:37 (pages 358-375).

know how big a table we need. However, if you should unexpectedly find yourself free that day we will happily make some room at the table, so please come join us!


#### **Nursery Available Sunday Mornings**

#### **Looking For A Food Pantry Assistant**

Holy Communion is looking for a new food pantry assistant. This is a paid position. The assistant works 21-23 hours per week. The job duties are listed below. Please contact Gregg Albright if you are interested or have questions at 262-989-6432.

#### Pantry Assistant's Duties

- 1. Pick up bakery three times a week from two different bakerles
- 2. Shop with Sharon in South Milwaukee at Aldi's if they can't get enough in Racine
- 3. Pick up food from schools, churches, etc. when they have food drives
- 4. Break up cardboard boxes and take them to the boiler room
- 5. Restock cupboards
- 6. Restock freezers
- 7. Weigh all donations coming in and record the weight
- 8. Clean seven freezers and two refrigerators
- 9. Vacuum
- 10. Steam mop floors
- 11. Directs volunteers when Community Action Agency and Racine County Food Bank deliver monthly food, directing placement of food on pallets and in freezers
- 12. Checks food for mold, dents, dates, infestation, leaks, and being partially used
- 13. Gets meat from storage freezers to pantry freezers twice a week
- 14. Helps bring in donations from different churches, individuals, and pantry shoppers
- 15. Shops at Aldi's if needed
- 16. Consolidates and organizes storage are to maximize space for food shipments
- 17. Drops off plastic waste at Festival Foods on Highway 20
- 18. Sorts through donations from Racine County Food Bank, Community Action Agency, other churches, and individuals
- 19. Cover workload when pantry director is not available
- 20. Assemble meal kits at busy times of the year (Thanksgiving, Christmas)
- 21. Assist In unloading and storing deliveries from volunteer shoppers
- 22. Set up Racine County Food Bank shipments twice weekly on days the pantry is open to serve clients



#### **Medical Equipment Lending Closet**

Did you know we have a lending closet with medical equipment such as canes, walkers, shower chairs, etc. for people to borrow? Often these items are needed only for a short time after an illness or surgery, and they can be costly to purchase. Right now we have crutches, canes, raised toilet seats, shower chairs, walkers, and a wheel chair. You can use the borrowed equipment for as long as it is needed. We only have one or two of some items, so availability does vary. If you or a family member or friend needs an item, call the church office, 632-8802, and we will check to see if we have what you need available. If you have medical equipment you no longer need to use, please consider donating it to our lending closet. Donations can be brought to the church office during the week or to church on Sunday mornings.
