Let us return to God, confessing our sin in the assurance of God's abiding love.


Compassionate One,


The holy gospel according to Luke, the thirteenth chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.


I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.




#### Hear our prayer.


