THIRD TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY will meet by ZOOM in January. Julie will be in Phoenix over the winter months so she can continue to lead our study on the Gospel of Mark staying warm in our homes and on the computer. It will be January 21st from 10:00 to 11:30 discussing Mark 14:12 to Mark 14:31 on pages 385 to 399 in William Barclay. This section of Mark begins with "Preparing For the Feast" (Mark 14:12-16). Barclays points out that Jesus had made arrangements for the upper room just as he had arranged for the colt on Palm Sunday.

In "Love's Last Appeal" (Mark 15:17-21) Jesus is offering Judas a chance to reconsider his betrayal. As Judas leaves, Jesus takes the bread and wine for the Passover Feast and they become "The Symbol of Salvation" Mark 14:22-26 (page 392).

In Mark 14:27-31 Jesus shares his awareness that "You will all fall away from me" (14:27). This is a tough question for each of us. Will we stand by our faith when it is challenged? We participate in worship and study to keep us firm in our beliefs.

Book Club

The book club will be meeting on January 8, 2025 at 10:00-11:30. At this meeting, we will be discussing <u>Grandma Gatewood's Walk: The Inspiring Story of the Woman who saved the Appalachian</u> <u>Trail by Ben Montgomery.</u>

Emma Gatewood, 67, a great-grandmother, told her family she was going for a walk. She left her small Ohio farm with a change of clothes and about two hundred dollars. The next they heard, she had walked 800 miles of the 2,050-mile Appalachian Trail. By September 1955, she stood atop Maine's Mount Katahdin and proclaimed, "I said I'll do it and I've done it!" Grandma Gatewood not only hiked the trail alone, she was the first person to walk it twice and three times. The public attention and her television appearances brought attention to the lousy, difficult stretches of the trail which led to bolstered maintenance and very likely saved the trail from extinction. The author shines a fresh light on one of America's most celebrated hikers.




