Thank you for your "change" that helped support the efforts of our Sunday School children to make a positive "change" in our church, community and world.

#### Food Pantry




The number of clients our pantry has been serving is increasing while the amount of food we receive from Racine County Food Bank and the government has been much smaller than in the past. This means we have had to purchase much more food. Sharon totaled the cost of the items the pantry purchases for a family of four and it added up to \$33.31, and more for a larger family. With numbers like these we are quickly going through the money in the pantry account. We need your help! Please consider picking up a few extra items when you shop for your family or make a financial contribution to the pantry.

For July the pantry is asking for donations of jelly, 18 oz. peanut butter, 1 lb. egg noodles, pancake mix, syrup, and instant potatoes.

We also collect pens and pencils, cookbooks, and greeting cards to share with our clients. Thanks to everyone who contributes to the pantry and to our wonderful, dedicated volunteers. We could not do this without you!

#### **Third Tuesday Bible Study**


In July our study group will discuss the second chapter of Acts. William Barclay refers to the book as The Acts of the Apostles. And this chapter certainly sets the stage for the remarkable impact of the witness of the early disciples. It begins with the day of Pentecost when tongues, "like tongues of fire," settled on each of them and "they began to speak in other tongues" (Acts 2:4). On this day, "the disciples" had an experience of the power of the Spirit flooding their beings such as they had never experienced before" (page 23).

The message the disciples would proclaim was that the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus fulfilled Old Testament prophecy (page 25). On page 28 Peter tells the Jews, "in Jesus, God arrived in person on the scene of human history." Barclay says it this way: "Acts stresses the resurrection as the final proof that Jesus was indeed God's chosen one" (page 30). Then Peter tells them to repent and be baptized so their sins can be forgiven (Acts 2:38). "And on that day there were added to them about 3000 people" (Acts 2:41). "Daily the Lord added to them those who were being saved" (Acts 2:47). People were hungry to hear about a loving God who came to save them.

Barclay describes the early church as learning, praying, and worshipping together. Let us meet together to learn and pray and grow in our faith. July 15th meet at Julie Burton's home, 136 Steeplechase Drive, from 10:00 to 11:30 to discuss the second chapter of Luke. Bring whatever translations of the Bible you have to enrich our discussion.

For our book club meeting on July 9, we will be discussing Of Love and Treason by Jamie Ogle.

#### **Scrip Cards For All Your Summer Plans**

Scrip cards can be useful for all of your summer plans. There are grocery cards for your BBQ and picnic supplies, restaurant cards for the days it is just too hot to cook, cards for department and clothing stores for beach towels and swim suits, home improvement stores for all your backyard and garden DIY projects, and of course, gas cards for all your road trips. There are even scrip cards for hotels! Shopping with scrip is an easy way to support HCLC when you



shop. HCLC purchases the cards for a discounted rate so we earn a percentage for every card you purchase. You pay the face value of the card and get to spend the full value of the card. There are lists of the participating retailers in the Welcome Center and on the tables at the back of the sanctuary. #### **Medical Equipment Lending Closet**

Did you know we have a lending closet with medical equipment such as canes, walkers, shower chairs, etc for people to borrow? Often these items are needed only for a short time after an illness or surgery, and they can be costly to purchase. Right now we have crutches, canes, raised toilet seats, shower chairs, walkers, and a wheel chair and we just got a donations of a scale, a blood pressure cuff, and a small, two step wheelchair ramp. You can use the borrowed equipment for as long as it is needed. We only have one or two of some items, so availability does vary. If you, a






