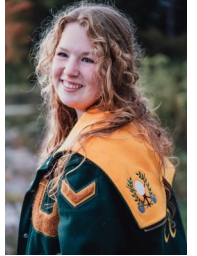


Congratulations Graduates!

Blessings from Tithe Money

Many of you will remember the wonderful blessing we received last calendar year from estate money. In years past we had approved a continuing resolution to set aside a 10% tithe from larger donations received by the church. Last year's estate gift resulted in a tithe fund and we asked for the congregation to give input on what the council should do with that money. We received many wonderful suggestions from all of you and after some discussion, decisions have been made. In addition, we still had some refugee funds that we had been looking for appropriate places to donate that left over money. Total funds to be distributed total \$82,640! What a blessing!

The council is pleased to report that the following is a list of local to global organizations that will each receive some of our funds! Over the next few months, checks will be delivered or mailed to these organizations and we will highlight them and what they do in weekly bulletins.

These funds are from previous loans that had been repaid:

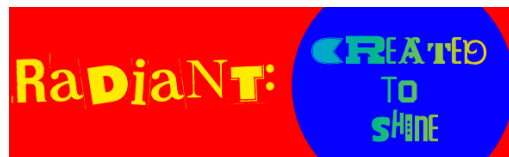
Canned goods for inventory to open a store - \$25

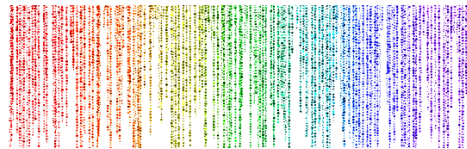

For June, the book club is reading a critically acclaimed novel by Chinua Achebe, Things Fall Apart, his first novel in a trilogy of Africa's cataclysmic encounter with European colonial presence. Told through the fictional experiences of Okonkwo, a wealthy and fearless Igho warrior in the late 1800's. The novel explores one man's futile resistance to the devaluing of his Igho traditions by British political and religious forces and his despair as his community capitulates to the powerful new order. The novel provides one of the most illuminating and permanent monuments to the African experience. Achebe captures life in a precolonial African village, he conveys the tragedy of the loss of that world.

THIRD TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY

June 16th from 10:00 to 11:30 we will meet to discuss Acts 14:19 to Acts 16:5 on pages 128 to 141. It begins with the Jews stoning Paul and dragging him out of the city leaving him for dead! (Acts 14:19-20) Well, Paul survived and went on to a different city, Derbe. Then in Acts 14:21-28 Paul and Barnabas travel on to 3 different cities and reported to the church of their success among the Gentiles. Now the Jewish converts argued that the Gentiles must be circumcised (Acts 15:1-5). After Peter addresses the Jewish leadership, James tells them to “stop making things difficult for the Gentiles who turn to God” (Acts 15:13-21).

Now Paul suggests that they return to cities to see how things are going with them (Acts 15:36-41). This begins a three year missionary journey that extended beyond Asia into Europe. That's when Paul met Timothy (Acts 16:1-5) and brought him along on his journey.

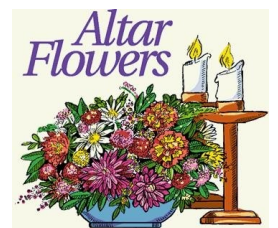
Hospital Visitation

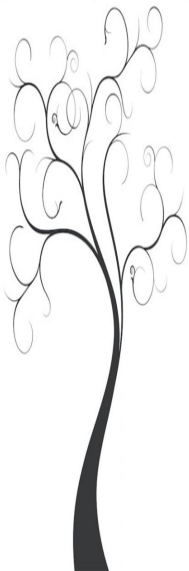
