² After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen



Food Pantry

The food pantry is asking for donations of 10 oz. cans of tomato soup and chicken noodle soup, 15 oz. cans of pork & beans, 15 oz cans of peaches and mixed fruit, and 15 oz. cans or pasta with meat (spaghetti's etc.) The number of clients has been increasing while the food we receive from Racine County Food Bank and the government has been decreasing which means we have had to purchase more food ourselves. The cost of this food is \$33.31 for a family of four, more for a larger family. Please no animal food. We also collect pens and pencils, cookbooks, and greeting cards to share with our clients. We can use lightly used plastic shopping bags and brown paper bags which we use to pack groceries. Thanks to everyone who contributes to the pantry and to our wonderful volunteers. We could not do this without you!

NOISY OFFERING for Sunday School Year 2024/2025
