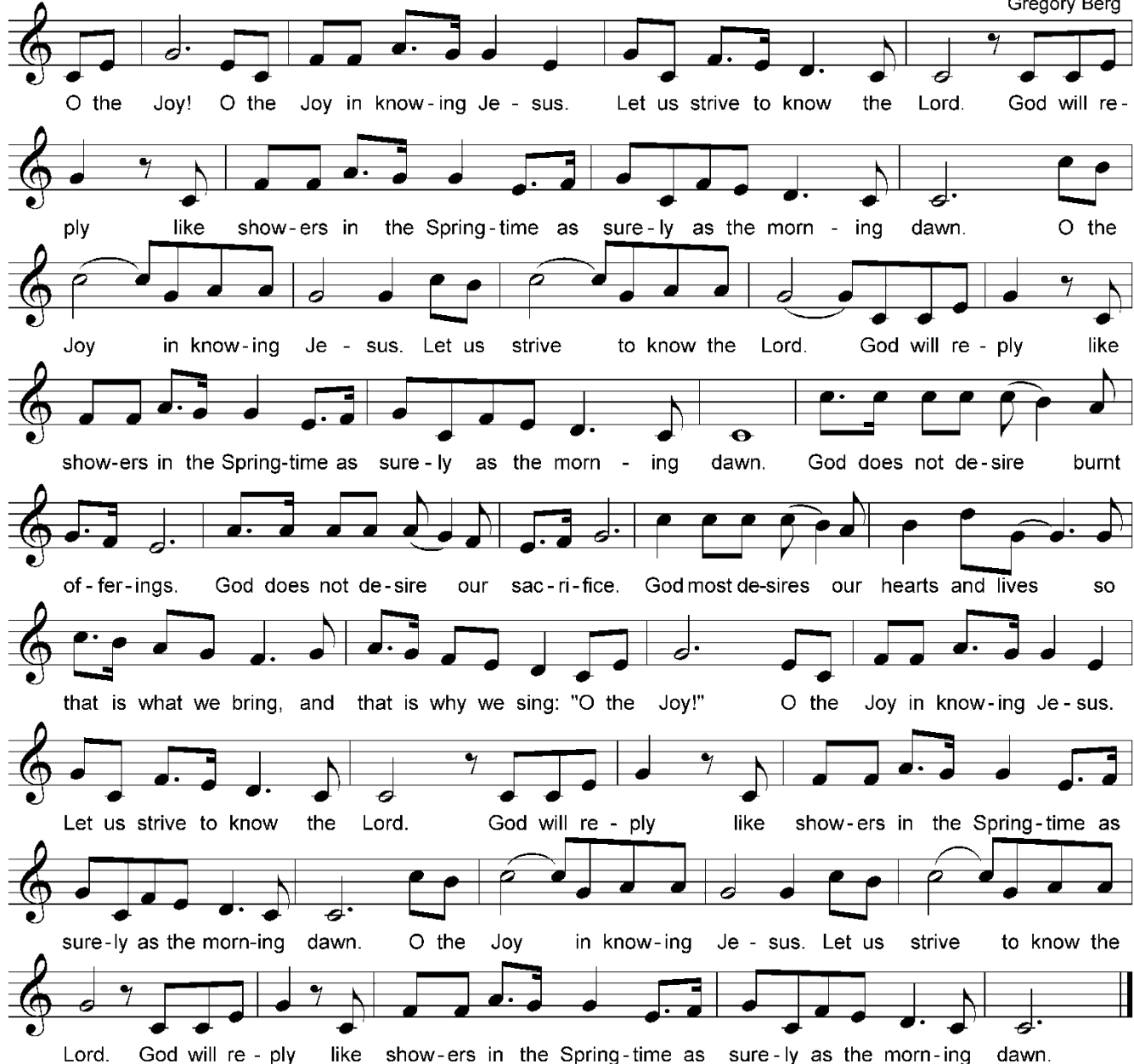

I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³ Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?’ ³⁴ And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. ³⁵ So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart.”

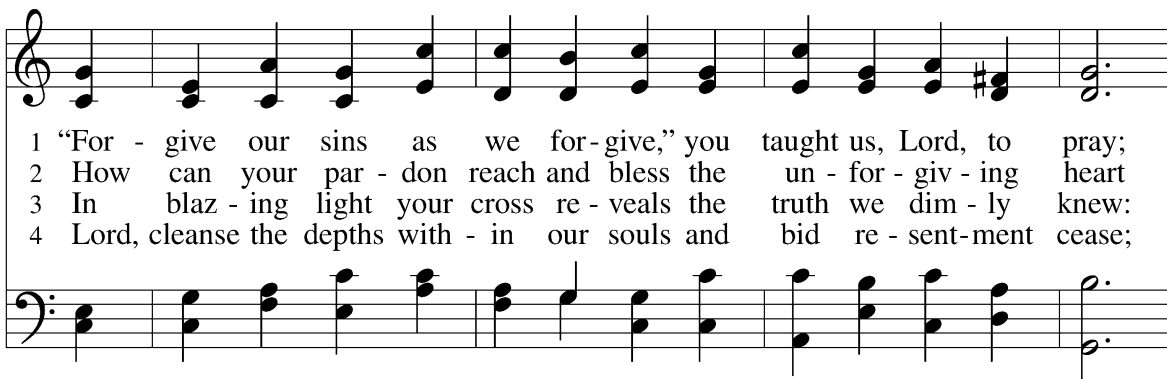

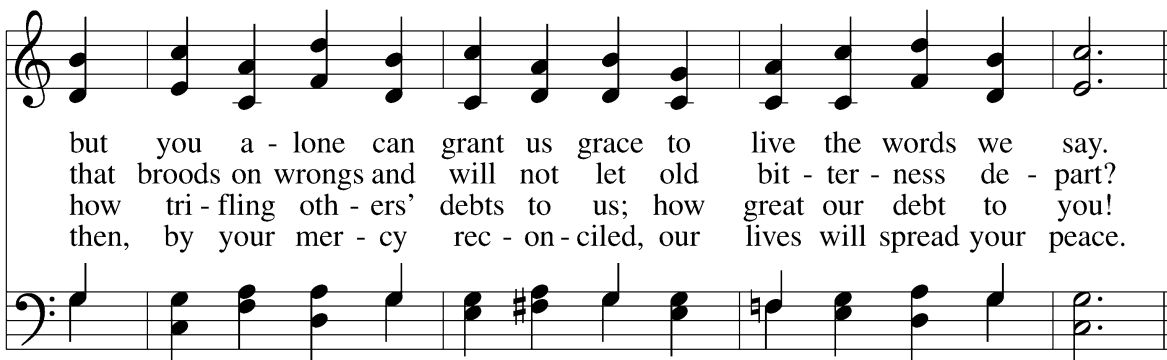

Then in Acts 18:18-23 Paul "Returns To Antioch" (pages 161-162).

"The Entry Of Apollos" (18:24-28) introduces a Jew who very effectively taught about Jesus and was a great help to these new Christians. Paul was also teaching in Ephesus and stayed almost three years. Christianity is truly spreading through the Roman Empire beyond the Jews and among the Gentiles.
