# THIRD TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY

William Barclay leads our discussion of the Acts of the Apostles, chapters 5 and 6, pages 49 to 61. Last month we read about Peter and John being arrested by the Sadducees. Aware of the trouble they faced, they prayed for courage and continued to witness that Jesus was the Son Of God. As if trouble from the Sanhedrin wasn't enough, page 49 describes "Trouble In the Church." One of their members sold some of their land to give money to the church. Instead, they held back some of the money. When Peter confronted him about it, he died!! When Peter asked his wife about it, she died too! Their failure to be truthful was a sin.

"The Attraction Of Christianity" (5:12-16) through its many signs and wonders, meant that they were held in high esteem. So again, the Sadducees arrested Peter and John (page 52). This time, Gamaliel (one of the Pharisees) said that if it was not of God it would just die out. Now the Apostles were free to witness (page 57).

But again there were tensions among these early Christians. They collected money to distribute among the needy. The Jerusalem Jews were not sharing with Jews from other countries. So a committee of seven was appointed to solve the problem. Among them, Stephen spoke up to spread the gospel to all people, not just the Jews. Our lesson ends on page 61 with Stephen's defense that all through history God has commanded them to go beyond their man-made borders.



For our October 8th meeting, we will be discussing <u>The Briar Club</u> by Kate Quinn. We meet from 10:00 until 11:30.

The story is set in Washington D. C. in 1950, the height of the Joseph McCarthy era. Everyone keeps to themselves at Briarwood Boarding House. It is in the heart of our nation's capital, where secrets hide behind the white picket fences. The mysterious widow, Grace March, moves in the attic room, she draws in her oddball collection of neighbors. First there's poised English beauty, Fliss, then there's the policeman's daughter, Nora, then the frustrated baseball star, Bea, and finally, poisonous, gung-ho, Arlene. Grace's weekly dinner parties and teas become the healing balm on all their lives, but each woman hides a terrible secret. When a shocking act of violence tears the house apart, the Briar Club must decide, who is the real enemy? Capturing the paranoia of the McCarthy era and evoking the changing roles for women in postwar America, the novel is an intimate and thrilling story of secrets and loyalty put to the test. # **Shopping With Scrip Cards**

# **Hospital Visitation**

Please remember to contact the church office if you or a family member is hospitalized, in a nursing home, or becomes home bound. Due to HIPPA privacy laws, medical facili ties cannot release information on their patients, so the church will not know you have been ill. You can decide if you want to receive a visit or have your name on the prayer list read in church. If you wish, along with the visits we will add your/their name to the mailing list for the newsletters and the wonderful holiday cards from our Sunday School students. If you notice a friend or someone who usually sits near you in church is not attending for a stretch, we would like you to tell us that too, so we can check in with them. # **Medical Equipment Lending Closet**

Did you know we have a lending closet with medical equipment such as canes, walkers, shower chairs, etc for people to borrow? Often these items are needed only for a short time after an illness or surgery, and they can be costly to purchase. Right now we have crutches, canes, raised toilet seats, shower chairs, walkers, and a wheel chair and we just got a donations of a scale, a blood pressure cuff, and a small, two step wheelchair ramp. You can use the borrowed equipment for as long as it is needed. We only have one or two of some items, so availability does vary. If you, a family member, or friend needs an item, call the church office, 632-8802, and we will check to see if we have what you need available. If you have medical equipment you no longer need to use, please consider donating it to our lending closet. Donations can be brought to the church office during the week or to church on Sunday mornings.
