For September the pantry is asking for donations of bar soap, tuna, peanut butter, jelly, cereal, and saltines.

This makes the donations we receive from you more important than ever so that we can continue to provide healthy, balanced meal items for those in need in our community. We are incredibly grateful to all who add a few items for the pantry to their shopping carts. We know budgets are tight for many people and we give thanks for your generous gifts to our ministry.

We always need brown paper grocery bags and clean, lightly used, plastic shopping bags. If you have 2024 calendars, greeting cards or pens and pencils you will not use, please bring them to the pantry. We have also had requests for Bibles and children's Bible storybooks. If you have any you no longer use you can donate them to the pantry.

As always we are so very grateful to all who contribute money and food and those who volunteer their time. We could not continue this ministry without your help!

Third Tuesday Bible Study

September 19th will be the next gathering for the monthly Bible study of the Gospel of Mark. We will discuss Mark 7:31 to Mark 8:26 on pages 207 to 221. William Barclay describes this section as Jesus preparing his disciples for their role in spreading the gospel after he is gone. "Doing All Things Well" (page 207) is when Jesus and his disciples take a long eight month journey through a primarily Gentile region when Jesus is teaching his disciples that he is the



Christ. The miracle of the deaf man being cured becomes well-known and a crowd of 4,000 seek him out. The miracle of feeding this large crowd vividly demonstrates that Jesus is reaching out beyond the Jewish community and has come to the Gentiles as well.

Then Barclay speaks to us and not just discusses the scripture. Are we those who "The Failure To Learn From Experience?" (page 216). That gives us something to think about which is continued in Mark 8:22-26 (pages 219-221). after describing healing a blind man, Barclay reminds us that being a Christian is a learning process, that our faith must be continually fed for continuous growth.

This is a section of miracles, but also an awareness that Jesus wants his disciples to be prepared for his absence. Do they realize that he is the Christ? Do they understand the message that reaches out to the Gentiles? Soon he will be crucified. Will they carry on Christ's ministry?

The message is also for us to continue growing in our faith. Participating in a Bible study enables us to grow and appreciate our faith. September 19th, from 10:00-10:30, our study of the Gospel of Mark continues. We meet at Julie Burton's house, 136 Steeplechase Drive. Phone 262:639-5914.

Ketchup Club


