
#### THIRD TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY

The study of The Acts Of the Apostles will meet Tuesday, September 16th, at 10:00 at the home of Julie Burton. In the third chapter of Acts, Peter and John went to the temple courts for prayer where a lame beggar reached out to them for healing. Then 5000 heard how the Word foretold about Jesus and believed that he fulfilled Old Testament prophecy.

Wealthy Sadducees were irate and got the temple police to arrest them (page 41). Peter knew he would risk his life to speak out, but had "Loyalty Only To God" (page 44). The healed lame man spoke openly about his miracle and the Sanhedrlin criticized them but could find no legal charge against them (page 44). Instead, they forbid them to speak about Jesus (page 45).

When Peter and John came back with "The Triumphant Return" (page 46), the people prayed for the strength to be bold (page 47). Then came the concern for the needs of one another. Page 48 tells how the believers would sell their goods and give to those in need. Truly a witness of the early Christians was their focus on helping each other sharing whatever they had.

Meet September 16th from 10:00 to 11:30 at Julie Burton's home, 136 Steeplechase Drive, to discuss Acts 4:1 to 4:37. Bring your Bibles for an interesting discussion.



Dear Lights of Holy Communion,

Hopefully you've had a chance to see our beautiful windows in person or been able to watch on-line (there are 4 live streaming videos dated August 1st and 2nd) as Willet Studio workers removed one of the large windows to take back to their studio. It's quite a dramatic difference. Over the next 9-12 months Willet will be restoring the removed window and will be back (tentatively) next Spring or Summer to put it back in and finish the window project portion of our 3 year capital campaign.


The theme of the campaign is "Light, in a Place Called Hope," and our goal is to raise a total of \$700,000 over 3 years (2026-2028). We are well on our way to getting to our pledging goal of \$700,000 by this fall. At the writing of this letter we have approximately \$250,000 left to reach our goal.

The largest portion of the money raised in this campaign (\$450,000) is being used for renovations and repairs to the stained glass windows in our sanctuary. The remaining portion of the funds are being used on updates to the elevator, replacing windows in the parish house and repairing the damaged retaining wall. If there is any money left over, we will consider other projects.

We are asking you to prayerfully consider what you can contribute over the next 3 years and fill out the enclosed pledge form. The "giving" portion of the campaign is planned to begin January 2026 and continue through the next 3 years (2026-2028), although pledges and donations will be gratefully accepted at *any* point!

If you have not yet had a chance to turn in your 3 year pledge, please do so by September 14th, so we can wrap up the pledging portion of the campaign. A pledge form is included with this mailing and there are additional forms available in the church office. If you have any questions please reach out to anyone on the church council or finance team.



#### **Prayer Team**



If you notice a friend or someone who usually sits near you in church is not attending for a stretch, we would like you to tell us that too, so we can check in with them. #### **Medical Equipment Lending Closet**

Did you know we have a lending closet with medical equipment such as canes, walkers, shower chairs, etc for people to borrow? Often these items are needed only for a short time after an illness or surgery, and they can be costly to purchase. Right now we have crutches, canes, raised toilet seats, shower chairs, walkers, and a wheel chair and we just got a donations of a scale, a blood pressure cuff, and a small, two step wheelchair ramp. You can use the borrowed equipment for as long as it is needed. We only have one or two of some items, so availability does vary. If you, a family member

If you have medical equipment you no longer need to use, please consider donating it to our lending closet. Donations can be brought to the church office during the week or to church on Sunday mornings.
