Tithe Spotlight: Uphaven

Uphaven is a non-profit that connects volunteer pilots and drivers with families who need treatment at Children's hospital. It was started in memory of Leni, their baby girl, by Ben and Tracy. Children's hospital was only minutes from their home and they made many trips to and from Children's Hospital of Wisconsin during her short 19 day life. The following story is one example of how they have made Uphaven's mission about more than transportation. Uphaven is helping families access care with less stress, more support, and moments of relief along the way.

On Mother's Day, volunteer pilot, Marie, flew a family from Osceola, Wisconsin to Milwaukee, and volunteer pilot, Brian, flew them back home the next day, so their 11-month-old daughter could receive treatment at Children's Wisconsin for severe pulmonary hypertension.

For this family, accessing care means traveling five hours by car each way. Children's Wisconsin in Milwaukee is the closest facility offering the specialized care their daughter needs.

Instead of spending the holiday on the road, the family was able to spend Mother's Day together before departing that evening on a flight for Milwaukee. The flights turned what could have been a stressful journey into a memorable experience, with scenic views for mom and dad and a comfortable nap for their daughter. In Milwaukee, volunteer driver, Ben, helped with car transportation, ensuring the family could focus on their daughter's care rather than the logistics of travel.

The Uphaven team is grateful to Marie, Brian, and Ben for donating their time, aircraft, and compassion to support this family. To learn more visit flyuphaven.org.
