





⁶ "Moreover, the Lord your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your descendants, so that you will love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, in order that you may live. ⁷ The Lord your God will put all these curses on your enemies and on the adversaries who took advantage of you. ⁸ Then you shall again obey the Lord, observing all his commandments that I am commanding you today, ⁹ and the Lord your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all your undertakings, in the fruit of your body, in the fruit of your livestock, and in the fruit of your soil. ¹¹ "Surely, this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. ¹² It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' ¹³ Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' ¹⁴ No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe.


²⁹ But wanting to vindicate himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" ³⁰ Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. ³¹ Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. ³² So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan while traveling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. ³⁴ He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵ The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.' ³⁶ Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" ³⁷ He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."





Food Pantry

The food pantry is asking for donations of jelly, 18 oz. peanut butter, 1 lb. egg noodles, pancake mix, syrup, and instant potatoes. Please, no dog or cat food. The number of clients served has been increasing while the food we receive from Racine County Food Bank and the government has been decreasing which means we have had to purchase more food ourselves. The cost of this food is \$33.31 for a family of four, more for a larger family. In June our pantry served 360 households, a total of 1069 individuals. We greatly appreciate any support you can give us!

We also collect pens and pencils, cookbooks, and greeting cards to share with our clients and we accept donations of lightly used plastic shopping bags and brown paper bags for packing groceries. Thanks to everyone who contributes to the pantry and to our wonderful volunteers. We could not do this without you!

Collecting School Supplies for Local Kids and Schools

Hope on a hill! That's HCLC's mantra and our pledge. So let's put hope into action - here in the neighborhood where we worship. As any teacher will tell you, many of the students in our schools come with great needs. We'd like to help by offering school supplies to the kids and teachers of the church's neighborhood.
