

Noisy Offering Impact

Those small amounts of change can really make a difference when we work together! A total of \$519.22, which includes the January Noisy Offering collections (\$239.09) and the February Noisy Offering collections (\$280.13), was sent to Lutheran World Relief for helping victims of the California wildfires.

Third Tuesday Bible Study

Our study of the Gospel of Mark will conclude this month on April 15th. Just as we will acknowledge Holy Week in April, our study will deal with the awful events of the arrest of Jesus on Thursday night, the false accusations of the Jewish Sanhedrin, the crucifixion, the resurrection, and the appearance of Jesus to his followers. So much happened in one week!

This begins on page 412 with Mark 15:1 and continues to Mark 16:20, "The Commission Of the Church." The whole Sanhedrin met after arresting Jesus on Thursday night. Since the Sanhed-

rin had no power to carry out a death penalty, they brought Jesus before Pilate with the political charge that Jesus claimed to be a king (page 413). Jesus was silent. Mark 15:6-15 tells the struggle Pilate had finding Jesus guilty, but he wanted to please the mob. Since Barabbus was considered a brave man popular with the crowd, the crowd shouted out to have Jesus killed. Adding insult to the crucifixion was "The Soldiers' Mockery" (Mark 15:16-20). Then Barclay described the horrible death on "The Cross" (pages 419-422). Barclay tells us that the death of Jesus shows "Limitless Love" of God for man and the suffering in our lives (page 422). On Good Friday Jesus suffers hours of

agony described in Mark 15:33-41.

Then, Joseph of Arimathaea asks Pilate for the body of Jesus and buries him in a tomb hewn out of rock (15:42-

47). Mark 16:1-8 (page 428) tells about two women who come to the tomb to annoint the body of Jesus. instead, an angel greets them announcing, "He is risen. He is not here." As exciting as that was, they are afraid and tell no one.

But Jesus appears to Mark of Magdala who tells the disciples who also do not believe (Mark 16:9-20). Then Jesus

Then Jesus appears to two disciples walking in the country who told the good news to other disciples who also do not believe that this could be true. Now Jesus appears to the eleven and charges them to "Go into the whole world and preach the good news" (page 431). We are proof that the love of Jesus has spread throughout the whole world.

Martha Ballard is summoned to examine a body found frozen in the Kennebec River in 1789. As a midwife and healer, Martha is privy to much of what goes on behind closed doors in Hallowell, Maine. Her diary is a record of every birth and death, crime and debacle that unfolds in the close-knit community. When a local physician undermines her conclusion, declaring the death to be an accident, Martha is forced to investigate the shocking murder on her own. Clever, layered, and subversive, the story introduces an unsung heroine who refused to accept anything less than justice at a time when women were considered best seen and not heard. A thrilling, tense, and tender story about a remarkable woman who left an unparalleled legacy yet remains nearly forgotten to this day. Anyone and everyone is welcomed to join us!

We will be reading and discussing The Women by Kristin Hannah for our May 14 meeting.

Save the Date! Church Picnic August 10th!


