Amen.



We are running out of these items and are not getting them from the government or Racine County Food Bank. The number of clients coming to the pantry has been rising and we have shortages of a number of items due to the lack of deliveries and an inability to purchase them in bulk. Our shoppers are having a hard time buying many of the things we need because of limited supplies at some of the grocery stores. This makes the donations we receive from you more important than ever so that we can continue to provide healthy, balanced meal items for those in need in our community. We are incredibly grateful to all who add a few items for the pantry to their shopping carts. We know budgets are tight for many people and we give thanks for your generous gifts to our ministry.

We always need brown paper grocery bags and clean, lightly used, plastic shopping bags. If you have greeting cards or pens and pencils you will not use, please bring them to the pantry. We have also had requests for Bibles and children's Bible storybooks. If you have any you no longer use you can donate them to the pantry.

As always we are so very grateful to all who contribute money and food and those who volunteer their time. We could not continue this ministry without you!

The disciples had just returned from teaching and healing as Jesus had taught them. They were exhausted! Yet, their hearts went out to the crowd seeking inspiration from the good news of God's love. Barclay discusses this event from pages 178 to 184.

As if this wasn't enough in one day, Mark 6:45-52 describes the disciples getting in a boat to cross over to Bethesda when a wind comes up making it difficult to row. Jesus sees the distress they were in and comes out to them walking on the water. There's no rest once they reach land on the other side. People recognize Jesus and spread the word. Now, Jesus the healer is the focus in Mark 6:53-56.
