This is a story for our time. It reminds us that our lives can be upended instantly.

It's interesting that Barclay says that "Jesus is pleading for a certain elasticity in our minds" (page 70). 
jelly (greatly needed!) instant potatoes pancake mix saltines cream of chicken soup bar soap

Looking For Vases




