During these next three months, our study of the Gospel of Mark will be held by Zoom. Most of you have had this communication before so it won't be difficult to adjust. I'll get on line about ten minutes early to see if we can all see each other. Don has to help me!

We will begin our study on page 265 with "Rewards and Punishments" (Mark 9:41-9:42). Mark encourages us with the promise that God rewards any kindness or help extended to another person. Then he also lets us know that anything done to cause a child to stumble will be punished.

This is followed by "The Goal Which Is Worth Any Sacrifice" (Mark 9:43). This is quite a strong judgement! If your hand, or your foot, or your eye causes you to stumble it is better to cut it off!! It is certainly clear that nothing can come between us and obedience to the will of God. Real happiness and real peace comes from an unhindered closeness to God.

Mark 9:49-50 talks about The Salt Of the Christian Life" (page 271-274). Salt adds flavor and purity to our food. And Christians bring the flavor of a meaningful life to a weary world. Enjoy a life at peace with one another and blessed with good will.

What a positive message as we begin the new year. February 20th from 10:00 to 11:30 our study of the Gospel of Mark will meet by Zoom to discuss Mark 9:41 to 9:50. See you there.
