### WE ARE THE STORIES THAT GOD TELLS...

#### OUR VERY LIVES ARE THE WORDS THAT COME FROM GOD'S MOUTH.

The following story is an excerpt from Philip Yancey's book, *The Likeness of God*.

He entered the room, and he apologized for the blood on his lab coat, explaining that he had just been dissecting armadillos, the only non-human species known to harbor leprosy bacterium. He wore outdated clothes, lived in a rented bungalow and drove an economical, rundown car. At the heart... Dr Paul Brand was still a missionary - just as his parents had been.

The first time that Yancey had visited him... they talked for a week. Yancey would follow the doctor around as he studied the ulcerated limbs of his patients. At night, they would share a meal of curried rice with Brand's wife Margaret - herself a respected Ophthalmologist. They put their feet on the table and turned on the tape recorder for discussions that ranged from leprosy and theology to world hunger and soil conservation.

Every topic that Yancey brought up, Brand had already thought about - in great depth. He quoted Shakespeare and discussed Latin, Greek and Hebrew words. During their breaks... Brand taught Yancey how to select a ripe fig (a butterfly would rest on it) and how the African Weaver bird built its elaborate nest, using only one foot and a beak. But the conversations that stood out were the ones about the **nobodies** on whom Brand and his wife gave medical attention.

When he began his pioneering work, he was the only Orthopedic Surgeon in the world - working among the 15 million victims of leprosy. He and his wife performed several dozen surgeries on some of these patients. They restored rigid claws into usable hands, they remade feet, they forestalled blindness, they transplanted eyebrows and fashioned brand new noses.

He spoke of his patient's family histories and the rejection that they had experienced because of disfigurement. Almost always his eyes would moisten and he would wipe away tears... as he remembered their suffering. They are among the most neglected people on the earth... but to Brand, they were NOT nobodies... but people made in the image of God. Dr. Paul Brand devoted his entire life to that very same purpose. He is a story that God tells... and so are we.

day, please come join us! Hope to see you there ☺

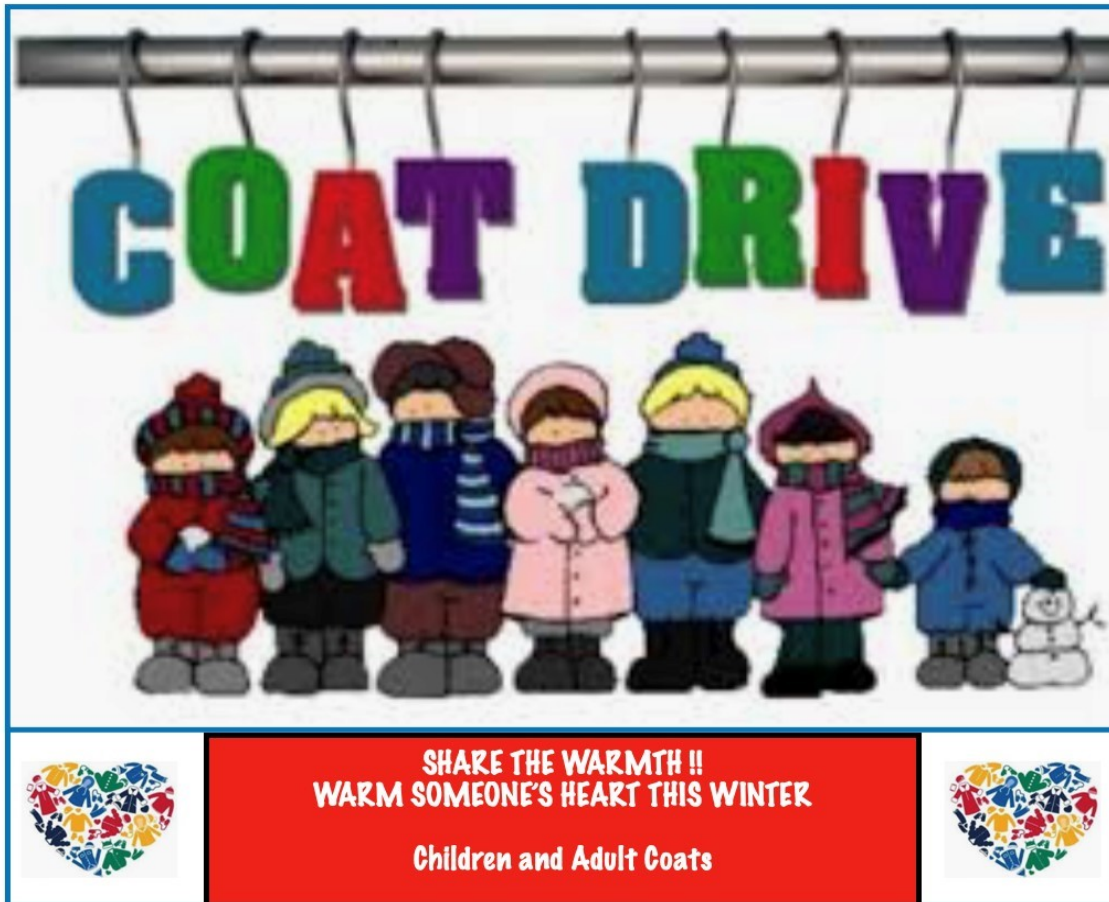


### Third Tuesday Bible Study

The November meeting of the book club will be November 8 at 10:00 to 11:30 at Julie Burton's home.

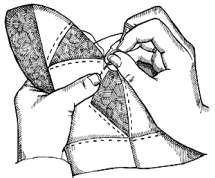

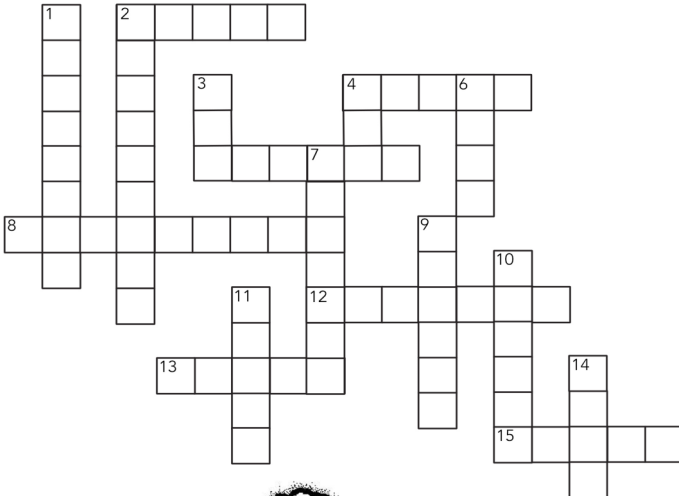
