

FIRST READING: Genesis 50:15-21


²³"For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. ²⁴When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; ²⁵ and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. ²⁶So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' ²⁷And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. ²⁸But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, 'Pay what you owe.' ²⁹Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' ³⁰But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. ³¹When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. ³²Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' ³⁴And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. ³⁵So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart."


APOSTLES' CREED




LORD'S PRAYER



Food Pantry

For September the pantry is asking for donations of **tomato soup**, **tuna**, **canned pasta**, **peanut butter**, **jelly**, **and cereal**. We have been serving a large number of clients (356 families, 1279 individuals in August) including many first time clients who have never been to a food pantry before. Due to the high number of clients being served, smaller deliveries from the government and Racine County Food Bank and difficulty buying many of the things we need because of limited supplies at some of the grocery stores, we are running very low on many foods. This makes the donations we receive from you more important than ever so that we can continue to provide healthy, balanced meal items



for those in need in our community. We are incredibly grateful to all who add a few items for the pantry to their shopping carts. We know budgets are tight for many people and we give thanks for your generous gifts to our ministry. We could not continue this ministry without your help!
