### Friends in Christ:

At our most recent synod assembly, held June 2-3 at the Italian Community Center in Milwaukee, the assembly adopted five resolutions. I am writing to the rostered ministers, congregations, and assembly voting members to provide an update on actions taken by me and the synod council in response to these resolutions.

- Resolution 1: Resolution to Amend the ELCA Constitution to Include Creation Care.
   This resolution directed the Greater Milwaukee Synod council to request that the ELCA Church council develop and vote on amendments to the ELCA governing documents to include creation care to the purposes of this church and of its members. This request was adopted at the July 20 synod council meeting and forwarded to the appropriate offices.
- Resolution 2: Resolution in Support of the Raise the Age Wisconsin Campaign. This
  resolution directed the GMS bishop to create a statement in support of this campaign,
  send it to various elected officials, share the resolution with the other ELCA synods in
  Wisconsin, and share educational information with the congregations and leaders of this
  synod and encourage their participation and support. Please see the statement and letter
  included in this mailing.
- Resolution 3: Resolution on Synod Guidelines for Continuing Education. This resolution called for an increase in the amount congregations are asked to offer rostered ministers for continuing education expenses to be included in the 2024 Synod Guidelines, and to provide clearer guidelines for what constitutes continuing education. The synod council will be approving the 2024 Compensation Guidelines at their September 17 meeting and will include an increase in Continuing Education amounts, and the revision of guidelines will be included in the charge given to the Synod Guidelines Committee called for in Resolution 4.
- Resolution 4: Resolution to Establish a Compensation Guidelines Committee. This resolution called for the synod council to form a Compensation Guidelines Committee or Task Force to annually review and propose guidelines for the coming year. This Committee will be appointed at the November synod council meeting. Those interested in serving indicate their interest in serving on this team by:

Each message should include: first and last name, email, phone number, congregation of membership and role in that congregation, and a note indicating interest in serving on the Compensation and Benefits Committee.

- Resolution 5: Resolution on Children and Vulnerable Youth. This resolution called on the synod council to form a task force charged with organizing events to listen to the youth of the synod, to encourage congregations of this synod to listen to their youth, and to request that the ELCA Church Council develop and consider amendments to the ELCA governing documents to include "supporting children and vulnerable youth" to the purposes of this church. This request was approved at the July synod council meeting and forwarded to the appropriate offices. The synod council will be appointing the task force at their November meeting that will be charged with organizing listening events and encouraging congregations to do the same. ### Men's Group Meeting Friday, October 6th





### **Third Tuesday Bible Study**

William Barclay's study of the Gospel of Mark for the month of October will focus on Mark 8:27 to 8:35 on pages 221-235. "The Great Discovery" focuses on Mark 8:27-30 when Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Jews had begun to dream of a time when they would become a great and powerful nation. Would the disciples believe in a god that would heal men's souls instead?



And would Jesus want to escape suffering and death? Mark 8:31-33 tells of Peter wanting Jesus to avoid such a future. But Jesus rebukes him with, "Get behind me, Satan."

"The Way Of the Disciple" (Mark 8:34-35) is one of carrying a cross. We must give up our desire to have everything go our own way and realize that following Jesus may demand sacrifices. Being a disciple is not a call to ease and luxuries but a call to look into the needs of others.
